MUSIC REVIEW Absurd' and more at The Ford Amphitheatre By Richard S. Ginell, Special to The Times

By day a mild-mannered musician and film composer, when Ross Wright gets anywhere near a podium, voila!, he becomes Elvis Schoenberg, fearlessly jumping boundaries of genre and taste in a single leap.

Not merely content to perform shotgun marriages between the likes of Wagner and Nancy Sinatra, Mussorgsky and Santana, Wright (er, Elvis) took on a more ambitious task Friday night at the Ford Amphitheatre — a "book musical" of a sort called "Symphony of the Absurd!" It was, as Ed Sullivan would have said, "a really big shew" in which Wright incorporated many of his set pieces and some newer numbers into a hellzapoppin' revue, with an eclectic assortment of dancers, sexy girls, pulp novel narrations, lighting effects, dry ice. In other words, it was a real hoot.

If anything, Wright's collages of this and that bring Frank Zappa to mind, the quick cuts between styles, the intricately difficult lines, the occasional jazz breaks. All the while Wright's affectionate and respectful of his audience's love of pop culture. At one point, where "Blue Suede Shoes" is sung against a wacky 12-tone setting, the idiom literally could be called Elvis Schoenberg.

Jason has appeared in many National TV commercials, Soap operas and appeared in the Oscar nominated film "Election".

Becky Baeling: This Diva's debut album on Universal Records, BECSTASY, made her the darling of the dance-music scene. The CD went on to garner #1 and #3 Billboard Dance hits, and Becky was named Best New Dance Artist of 2003 at the International Dance Music Awards and the #6 Dance Artist of the Year in Billboard Magazine. Her hit songs "Getaway", "If You Love Me", and "Heaven Is A Place on Earth" (featured currently in the movie "Sleepover") can all be heard on multiple CD compilations, and some of her other album cuts, "All Over Me" and "Diva", were used as theme songs for various segments on The Today Show. 2003 also saw several other debuts for Becky: Her soundtrack debut, with the anthematic song, "I'm Gonna Fly", heard in the Heather Graham/Marissa Tomei movie THE GURU, and her Television debut, with her "Saturday In The Park" duet with Brian McKnight, on Fox's Summer Music Mania.
